2023-2024 150% Warning Review Request

If you have received a “150% Warning” email regarding reaching 150% of the published required length of your program in cumulative attempted credits and wish to have the Financial Aid Office proactively review your circumstances in anticipation of possibly being put on suspension the next term you enroll, please fill out this form.

What does it mean to be on a "150% Warning" status? It is when a student is close to attempting more than 150% of the credit hours needed to graduate from their program of study. One more semester after receiving this status, even if all other satisfactory academic standards are met, the student will most likely be put on financial aid suspension.

For example, if you need 60 credits to graduate from your program, but you have already attempted 85 credits, you are reaching the 150% mark of 90 credits (60×1.5).

Remember, you are still eligible to receive your financial aid for the next term you enroll/attend. However, you will most likely be placed on Financial Aid Suspension at the end of the next term you complete, depending on your total number of attempted credits.

If you will be graduating and/or transferring, at this time, your financial aid status with Hawkeye Community College will not transfer to another college. However, if you choose to return to Hawkeye, you could be returning with a financial aid suspension status and not be eligible for financial aid in future semesters. If you have been placed on financial aid suspension, you would have the option to complete a Satisfactory Academic Progress Appeal to try to regain your financial aid eligibility.
